## Admission requirements:

A grade 12 high school diploma with a 75% average on 4 courses, that are part of the BC Ministry of Education's high school curriculum having a provincial exam, including English. Bishop's will take the student's best grade between their school work or their provincial exam. A grade 12 math course is also required for the Business program. A grade 12 math course and 2 grade 12 lab sciences are also required for our Science programs.

Students who have completed a full International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma with a grade total of 28 may be considered for admission to a three year (93 credit) program.

Students without the Diploma may be considered for admission to a four year (123 credit) program. Credit for individual Higher Level courses may be given against a four year program if the grade is 5 or better.

Advanced Placement (AP) examinations completed with a result of 4 or better will be accepted for credit against a four year (123 credit) program.

## Residence:

Bishop's guarantees residence accommodation for first year students. There are seven residence halls which house 670 students, at least 400 of whom are in first year. An information/application package is mailed to all admitted students.

## Student fees 2008-09:

Undergraduate tuition fees: \$5,378.40

Compulsory fees: \$911.00

On-campus housing: \$6,705.00 - \$7,745.00

## Scholarships / employment opportunities:

Bishop's University guarantees scholarships ranging from \$1000 to \$4000 per year, renewable for every year of a student's program (conditions apply). These scholarships are offered to all students with a minimum average of 80% on their best 4 grade 12 courses including English (As stipulated in the Admission requirements).

There are well over 200 jobs available on campus. There are also numerous opportunities to find employment off campus.
