<b>Scholarships:</b>	The Regular Officer Training Plan (ROTP), the normal application route to RMC, is like a full-ride four-year scholarship. All costs are covered, including a \$1,400 per month wage, in turn for five years of military service after graduation. Up to fifteen Reserve Entry Training Plan (RETP) applicants, paying their own way (\$6,000 tuition fee), can use scholarship funds from other sources. RETP cadets have no service obligations after graduating.

## Undergraduate Admissions/Program Information:

<b>Student Population:</b>	<p>RMC is a small university that offers all courses in both French and English. There are two campuses with about 1100 undergraduate students at Kingston and 200 at St. Jean. This is the traditional core group of students living on campus. Most BC students will enter RMC Kingston directly, taking the full four-year university degree program there.</p> <p>RMC St. Jean offers the 2-year Quebec College CEGEP system, equivalent to Grade 12 and first year university in other provinces. Students from BC have the opportunity to enter RMC St. Jean at either level depending on their academic needs. Cadets then proceed to RMC Kingston to complete their degree program.</p> <p>RMC Kingston also has about 750 students in the Masters and Doctorate programs. In addition, there are approximately 6000 students (military members and dependants around the world) taking part-time and distance education courses.</p>	
<b>Admissions Average Early:</b>	Above 85%	
<b>Minimum Admissions Average:</b>	There is no minimum as the program is competitive and the threshold varies from year to year. Solid "A" Grades will help to ensure acceptance at RMC and some "B" Grades will put one in with the "crowd". Practically speaking, averages below 75% in the core subjects would not be competitive. All applications above 70% average are accepted for processing.	
<b>Basic Admissions Requirements:</b>	By submitting an application, students are applying for full-time employment with the Canadian Forces and attendance at RMC becomes part of their professional development	

	<p>as future officers in the Canadian Forces.</p> <p>Applicants must be Canadian citizens, meet the medical and physical fitness standards for the Canadian Forces, obtain a passing standard in all the pre-enrollment tests, be at least 16 years of age and meet all the necessary academic requirements as outlined below.</p> <p>We review all academic records from Grades 10, 11 and 12, as well as any post-secondary education results to date. To enter the Science/ Engineering degree program, students require, as a minimum, English 12, Math 12 (Principles), Physics 12 and Chemistry 12. Calculus 12 is also strongly recommended. Science students can substitute Biology 12 for one of the sciences. Arts program applicants require as a minimum English 12 and Math 11 (Principles or Applications). However, the Grade 12 levels in Mathematics, Calculus, Physics and Chemistry are also desirable, as Arts students will be taking basic levels in those subjects at RMC as part of the core curriculum. A strong background in mathematics is preferred for those interested in a Business Administration degree.</p>
<b>Application Deadline:</b>	<p>Students are required to submit applications, prior to <b>15 Jan 09</b> but sooner (November) is better. Late applications received up to end Feb 09 may get considered, depending on the intensity of competition.</p> <p>The application process is extremely competitive. Each year, up to 330 applicants are selected to attend RMC. In addition, approximately 270 additional students will be fully subsidized under ROTP to attend civilian universities.</p> <p>To be successful, applicants should focus primarily on academic performance. However, we are looking for strong leaders. Therefore participation in extra-curricular activities, such as sports, cadets, part-time jobs and volunteer/community activities that demonstrate leadership potential will help to improve competitiveness.</p>
<b>Application Fee:</b>	There is no application fee.
<b>Online Application</b>	<p>Candidates can now submit the CF Employment Application Form on-line. That and other application forms and guidelines still have to be printed off, signed and submitted on paper. They are at <a href="http://www.forces.ca">www.forces.ca</a> under "Resources" and "How to Join". Applications will be processed by the nearest Canadian Forces Recruiting Centre (1-800-856-8488), which also has extensive information on academic and career choices.</p>
<b>Faculty/Program Areas/Schools:</b>	<p><b>Faculty of Engineering</b> featuring six major disciplines  <b>Science Faculty</b> with five major areas of study at both the General and Honors levels.  <b>Arts Faculty</b> with nine areas of study. RMC is one of the few universities in Canada with degrees in Military and Strategic Studies and Military Psychology and Leadership.</p> <p>RMC does not provide degrees in medicine, law, etc, but many graduates go on to become professionals such as doctors, lawyers, teachers and astronauts to name a few.</p> <p><b>Aboriginal Leadership Opportunity Year (ALOY):</b> Commencing in 2008, RMC introduced an academic upgrading program to prepare aboriginal students for university entrance under ROTP. Special application forms are on the website.</p>
<b>BC Provincial Exam Policy:</b>	Provincial Exams are optional. The requirements for English 12 Provincials are the same as UBC. Note that IB Grades are acceptable substitutes for Provincial Exams.
<b>Residence Information</b>	
<b>Residence Application:</b>	All cadets are automatically provided dormitory space. First year cadets will share a room, normally with someone speaking the other official language.
<b>Cost for Room and Board:</b>	Cadets pay their own room and board. About \$400 per month is deducted from ROTP cadets pay. Room and board is included in RETP cadet's tuition fees.
